• **STEP 02**

Define your club's mission and vision

Part 1: What is the purpose and objective of your club in distinction from other clubs in your school?

Part 2: How will the club reach this objective? What is missing in your school that your club wants to fulfill?

Part 3: What is the desired outcome and vision of your club's mission? What does your club want to become or create?

E.g. (Part 1) The mission of UW World Vision is to provide a platform for UW students of all interests, backgrounds, and skills to take part in the global fight for human rights and equality.

(Part 2) The club raises awareness for the most pressing global issues and fundraises for relief and development projects to create lasting change in the lives of children, families, and communities to overcome poverty and injustice.

(Part 3) We envision students of all backgrounds and interests to drive global change locally through the community.

• STEP 03 Define your club's values

What will be your club's distinctive culture? What are the guiding principles that will drive your club's decisions?

E.g. Welcoming, impact-drive, relational, collaborative, outspoken, supportive, positive attitudes, communicative, candid in giving feedback...

STEP 04

Define general and specific goals

What fundraising, advocacy, education/awareness, and team/community-building goals do you have for the club?

E.g. Start sponsoring a child as a club Raise two years' worth of funding to sponsor a child ($$39 \times 24 = 936)

E.g. Form partnerships and collaborations with other campus clubs to build a larger charity community and drive greater impact Collaborate with Craft 4 Charity student club to create cute animal clay charms to raise money for World Vision's gift catalog animals

STEP 05

Recruit your team!

REFERENCE TIMELINE & NEXT STEPS

week 00	Connect with WVC for staff support and resources. Register your interest here: <u>https://www.worldvision.ca/youth/act/actform</u>
week 01	Develop your club mission, vision, values, and goals Search on your Student Union website to learn about how clubs function. Connect with the Clubs Manager/ Team to consult them and inquire about resources available (e.g. graphic design, funding, meeting rooms) Ask about the processes of starting/reactivating a club in your school. Check the important dates for when to sign and submit your club constitution, apply for a booth at club's day, important meetings for presidents If you're in high school, find a teacher supervisor and discuss the process of club starting! Look for someone available and interested in your club's cause, such as a teacher who teaches humanities, civics, and global issues.
week 02	Recruit your core team (min. 3 people)! Grab your friends, spread the word, and tap your network. Get plugged into the World Vision Campus Leaders community and attend monthly meetings (ask WVC staff for meeting dates and time)
week 03	As a team - determine your semester and academic year goals. Start brainstorming ideas for events and fundraisers! Determine what and how many teams members/roles you'll need to execute your plans and ideas. Determine Club Structure
week 04	Begin recruitment and fill the vacant roles! Set up an application form. Spread the word through social media, student union, school posters, and university FB groups!
week 05	Review all applications and begin the interview process (Schedule interviews with applications through apps like Doodle). Once you've chosen your team, send out acceptance and rejection emails
week 06	Determine your meeting frequencies and logistics.
week 07	Plan your first team meeting and get started! Share with your team the club's vision, mission, and value. Allow them to expand and refine your club goals and ideas.
week 07	(For reactivating a club) Check with the Student Union regarding your club's bank account and funding from previous years. Check if the club has a locker and what resources are available. Connect with WVC Staff and request WV swags (e.g. stickers, t-shirts, banners and staff speaker presentation).
